Each year, at this time, we are afforded the opportunity to first reflect on the past 12 months and then look forward to the busy year ahead.

Despite facing some difficult years, our organization remained dedicated to providing Islanders with intellectual disabilities access to sports. A total of 697 athletes, including young athletes, were able to join community programs, SO Fun days, and competitive events both on the island and throughout the Atlantic region. Our achievements can be largely attributed to our extensive network of 432 volunteers and our ongoing partnerships with schools.

One of many highlights in 2024 fiscal year was our contingent representing Team PEI at the 2024 National Winter Games in Calgary in February 2024. PEI was represented by 33 athletes, 14 coaches and 6 mission staff who competed hard in 7 sports and made our organization and entire Province of PEI proud. Many personal bests were achieved and our medal count included 8 gold, 9 silver and 4 bronze. Not only was success achieved on a National level, but also on an International level as we had 3 athletes named to Team Canada as well as our very own Charity and Genna being named to the Mission staff.

We had another record-breaking year at our Enriching Lives Gala, in June where \$415,878 was raised to support our mission. This along with motionball's Marathon of Sport, LETR events and the continued generosity of organizations and individuals in our community has helped ensure financial viability for the current and foreseeable future.

SOPEI is very fortunate to have a staff that combines their skill with their passion to make SOPEI the best it can be. Our team works tirelessly every day to improve the organization, and for that, SOPEI is deeply grateful to all of you. A sincere thank you to Charity, Matthew, Sarah, Genna, Ellen and Amy for your leadership, dedication, passion and tireless efforts to SOPEI.
