



Making Ethical Decisions (MED) Online Evaluation

OVERVIEW

All volunteers taking on a coaching role are required to complete their Making Ethical Decisions (MED) Online Evaluation. The MED Online Evaluation helps coaches to identify the legal, ethical, and moral implications of difficult situations that may present themselves in the world of team and individual sport.

Special Olympics Saskatchewan is committed to creating a sport environment in which all individuals are treated with respect and dignity. Coaches and volunteers have a responsibility to create a sporting environment that is safe for all.

For volunteers who have completed the NCCP MED Training (\$50 registration fee): The MED Online Evaluation is free and there are unlimited attempts to successfully complete the evaluation.

For volunteers who have not completed the NCCP MED Training: The MED Online Evaluation will cost \$85. There are 2 attempts to pass the evaluation. If after 2 attempts, a passing grade of 75% is not achieved, the person will need to take the NCCP MED Training to re-attempt the Online Evaluation.

To register for MED, you will need an NCCP number and password. If you do not have an NCCP number or your password, there is a button on the login page at thelocker.coach.ca/ where you can establish your NCCP account and/or request your password. Keep all of your receipts for this course, as your Special Olympics Community will reimburse 100% of the fees for successfully completed courses.

How to complete the MED Online Evaluation

1. Go to www.coach.ca
2. Click on **The Locker** on the right hand side of the page
3. Login using your NCCP # and password
4. Click on the eLearning tab
5. On the left hand side of the page, click on the tab that says **Make Ethical Decisions (MED) Online Evaluation**.
6. If you have attended a MED Training, you will qualify for free attempt(s) and will be able to just click the **continue & begin** buttons. If you have to pay, there will be a **Pay Now** button where you will pay the \$85 fee. Remember to save your receipts!
7. Select the pathway that best describes the context in which you volunteer with Special Olympics. If you are unsure, select the Competition-introduction pathway.
8. You must receive a 75% on this exam to pass the course.

Once you have completed the challenge exam, please send a short email to the Program Coordinator at Special Olympics Saskatchewan stating that you have completed the exam. Submit your receipts to your local Special Olympics Community Executive Council.
